**Slava Isusu Khrystu!**

When authorities want to discourage drivers from speeding here in Yorkton, they place a narrow piece of asphalt across the road. It is called a **“speed bump”**, and is meant to make us slow down. Allow these thoughts to be your **Church’s speed bump**. On **February 27<sup>th</sup>**, we spiritually commence the holy season of **Great Lent**. SLOW DOWN and do some reflecting... Next Sunday we will celebrate our traditional **Forgiveness Service**...

We often mistakenly think that **“forgiveness”** is something that we **do** for someone else; yet in reality, it is a gift that we give to ourselves. Forgiving someone means being willing to overlook the wrong and pain that has been committed against you and then wisely moving on with your life. Indubitably part of you will strongly resist saying **“What? Forgive them? Did you see what they did to me? I will never forgive!”** But you must forgive! **“Not forgiving”** keeps you in an eternal struggle. Whereas, the willingness to forgive can bring a sense of peace and well-being. It effectively lifts anxiety and liberates you from depression. It enhances your low self-esteem and gives you much needed hope.

Whether you committed a sin or someone else committed it against you is not so important! If you are obsessing about it, YOU are the one who must act to change things. Who cares who started it! What is more urgent is **who will end it**. This is not to say that there is no such thing as right and wrong. Certainly, there are such things as aggression, dishonesty, and faithlessness. But if you are not willing to move on from the wrong done to you, this could be more painful for you than the original “hurt”.

Please do not foster a grudge for long periods of time. And for God’s sake and yours, do not be angry for months or years. Yes, perhaps you were the **“wounded innocent”**. The fault may be completely theirs. Yet you are the one who is a prisoner within...

We are not only called to forgive huge transgressions. There are hundreds of things in our daily lives that also need our forgiveness. Forgive those who cut you off in traffic. Forgive the person who stole your parking space. Forgive the one who took that last piece of cake that you had been waiting for. Forgive those who ignore you and forgive those who gossip about you. Forgive the person who was late and made you wait all afternoon. Forgive the person who laughed at you. And especially forgive yourself for the stupid and harmful things that you did to yourself!

Yes, forgive and forgive... and really listen to the words of your daily prayer: **“Father, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us”** It is so true, it is not always easy to forgive by one's own strength but then we are not alone! We have an **ever-loving God** to Whom we can turn for help. Remember how He looked down upon His tormentors from the cross and forgave them. God does give us the grace to do the same.

We must sincerely pray for this great blessing!

## Eparchy of Saskatoon Family and Life Office Bulletin:

February 2017

*“The future of the world passes through the family”*

*Familiaris Consortio, 79*



Family Day in Saskatchewan is on Monday, February 19, 2017. How are we going to spend it? We hear all the time about the importance of actually spending time together building relationships with our children or grandchildren and we even have a special day devoted to the cause. The epistle reading for Monday is the very short third letter of John. What follows is a reflection on some practical ‘take-aways’ from this scripture on how to have a fun, faith filled family day (or week):

### Putting Family First this Family Day:

The letter begins with the hope of “health” acknowledging that there is more than one kind of health. We need all types of health—spiritual, physical, mental and emotional. In living our family life balance is the key. Here is a three-fold plan for a happy, healthy family day celebration:

**Pray:** If we never have time to pray as family, maybe today is the day to start, even if you keep it short. Be sure to include a prayer of forgiveness and entrustment. A thoughtful ‘Our Father’ prayed together works—this is good for mental and emotional health as well. God is in control, not us.

**Play:** If it seems all we ever do together is sit or work perhaps today is the day to go outside (weather permitting) and play. Get active together. This is also a great release for tension and anxiety. It is really not necessary to have a big budget to find fun things to do that also benefit our general overall health.

**Listen and Say:** The other important point made by John’s letter is about conversation. It is in listening and talking that we are enabled to share what is in our heart. We are told, “No greater joy can I have than this, to hear that my children follow the truth.” The scripture also mentions that, “...we will talk together face to face.” These are connected. Most of us spend our time with our children telling them what to do—‘go here’, ‘do that’.... With all those directives we often don’t take time to have quality ‘face to face’ time. So, for today, lets slow down and take time to have a conversation over a meal—maybe one we plan and cook together. You may be surprised at the things you learn about your spouse and kids. Even when keeping it light and laughing together you will be building a foundation of trust for deeper conversations in the future. It may feel awkward at first but persevere, as it will get easier! Happy Family Day © DPL

### Prayer Suggestions:

- Put names or small pics of family members, godparents and friends in a jar. Pick people to pray for, offering up their intentions together.
- Pray a decade of the Rosary and after each ‘Hail Mary’ take turns thanking God for something and praying for someone (maybe the people whose names you picked, above).
- Say “Grace” before meals thanking God for what He has given you and then talk about how you as a family might do more to help those who do not have all these material gifts or who are lonely and do not have the gift of family. Make a plan for family and individual acts of service this coming lent. (Serving others is also mentioned in 3 John v. 5-7 as important to loving and following God—living in the truth. Gratitude and serving others gives us happy, healthy hearts!)

### Play Possibilities:

- Snow play—build a snowman, a snow fort or paint the snow with food coloring in water in a spray/squirt bottle.
- Go to the local playground and play—take hot chocolate and snacks.
- Take a nature walk, take pics of all the different kinds of birds you see—go home and try to identify them if you see some unfamiliar kinds.
- Stuck inside? Play balloon volleyball or tennis.

### Listen and Say (conversation starters):

- The virtue connected to the Decade of the Rosary we prayed today was...? (Look up on line if uncertain.) Name a famous person, saint or someone you know who exhibits that virtue.
- What is your favorite animal? Why?
- What’s your favorite silly face? (photo-ops?)
- What is your favorite family memory? Or, your funniest family memory?
- If you could meet anyone in history, whom would you like to meet? What would you ask them?
