

How Many Days Till Christmas?

This will be asked many times in the coming weeks. But will this question cause us to think about preparing for the HOLIDAY SEASON or the HOLY DAY, CHRISTMAS? In all the rushing around, it is easy to forget that Jesus is the reason for the season. This is why the Church provides us with the time of the PRE-CHRISTMAS FAST, PYLYPIVKA sometimes called ADVENT, which begins on November 15 in our Ukrainian Catholic Church.

This period of preparation is a time of expectation, a time to ready our hearts for celebrating the presence of the Lord in the child born in Bethlehem. Society tells us to prepare and expect for another reason. The parking lots at the malls will be full, there will be more traffic on the roads, and checkout lines will be busier. The world begins to prepare early and we are touched by it. Our preparation, however, should include reflection on the rich mercy of our God who shares His only Son with us.

Euthanasia: A Pastoral Letter to all Ukrainian Catholics

Praise be to Jesus Christ! - by Bishop Peter Stasiuk CSsR of Australia

"Know that the Lord is God! It is he that made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture." Psalm (99:3)

Dear Brothers and Sisters!

All life is a sacred and precious gift from God. As your bishop and teacher I write to you on a topic that threatens the sacredness of human life. Euthanasia, which is now euphemistically referred to as Voluntary Assisted Dying.

Over the last few months, the State Governments of Victoria and New South Wales have introduced legislation into their respective Parliaments which have the benign title of "Voluntary Assisted Dying Bill". These Bills will change the criminal code to permit doctors and other health professionals to become actively and deliberately involved in the premature death of patients. Motivated by a false sense of compassion the proponents of this legislation are also proposing government endorsed suicide. (This practice is sadly a reality in Canada already!)

Endorsing suicide as a solution to pain or suffering sends the wrong message, especially to the young. Suicide is a tragedy for the person who takes their own life, but it also seriously affects their family and community. It would be morally corrupt to legally endorse any form of suicide. The sanctity of human life is at the heart of our faith. The Church teaches.

"Nothing and no one can in any way permit the killing of an innocent human being, whether a fetus or an embryo, an infant or an adult, an old person or one suffering from an incurable disease, or a person who is dying. Furthermore, no one is permitted to ask for this act of killing, either for themselves or for another person entrusted to their care, nor can they consent to it, either explicitly or implicitly. Nor can any authority legitimately permit such an action. For it is a question of the violation of divine law, an offense against the dignity of the human person, a crime against life, an attack on humanity." (Catechism UGCC 909)

Nothing and no one can in any way permit the killing of an innocent human being, whether a fetus or an embryo, an infant or an adult, an old person or one suffering from an incurable disease, or a person who is dying.

Brothers and Sisters, no one takes pleasure in suffering, or seeing a loved one suffer." A gravely ill person needs love attention, prayer and spiritual support. Those who are close to the infirm — parents, children, family members, friends, and also doctors, nurses, clergy and other members of the church community are called to surround the infirm with such care. " (Catechism UGCC 910)

Government has a duty to help those who are suffering by providing and funding adequate palliative care facilities. The old, sick, infirm and dying are never to be considered a burden, but rather a gift that enables us to love at a deeper level.

I encourage you to speak up. Let your voice be heard. Contact your local member of parliament and let them know that Voluntary Assisted Dying — Euthanasia or assisted suicide are not the answer in a truly compassionate society.

The old, sick, infirm and dying are never to be considered a burden, but rather a gift that enables us to love at a deeper level. Psalm 99.3 reminds us that God made us and we are His. The sacredness of human life comes from God. Protecting it is of utmost importance to God. He takes this so seriously and personally because He made humanity to reflect Him. We are His earthly representatives, made in His image. To murder another person or to assist someone in taking their own life is to mount an attack on God!


