Beloved Parishioners and Guests,

A few years ago I shared some thoughts on the **role of the priest** in the **Christian community**. As we commence our Lenten preparation for the joyous feast of the Resurrection for 2018, I wish to re-state them. Please forgive me for the constant use of "I" - but this is my personal sharing. I cannot speak for others -only for myself!

*"As a priest I strive to commence each day with the celebration of the Divine Liturgy and lovingly pray for all those who have requested divine assistance – for those I remember and for those I have forgotten. I also pray that our Lord Jesus will use me in the course of the day to faithfully witness to Him, and in many diverse ways, be **HIM** for those I come in personal contact with as the hours of the day slip by!*

*"The priest is just a man called by God to serve, to heal, to forgive, to bless, to share the **Good News** – that God Our Father in heaven truly loves each of us so very much. The priest must willingly be prepared to use his weak and frail humanness and he, like Christ, must use this 'humanness' most generously to help others and himself to become more 'divine' and ever more Christ-like...*

*"Often this great responsibility frightens me; often I am very much aware of how I frequently fail to fulfill this lofty ideal and sincerely pray for forgiveness for the many times I have become an unfortunate "**obstacle**" rather than a living "**channel**" of God's bountiful blessings.*

*"I fondly reflect over the week and prayerfully recall how the hands and heart of a priest were needed and even used – I vividly re-live the pain and hurt of a family who have sadly lost a '**loved one**' and desperately needed the presence of a priest. I pray to God that my words of comfort were Christ's embracing words...*

*"I humbly consider the Christ-given power that is granted to the priest, unworthy as we are, to celebrates the sacrament of **forgiveness** and thus to offer peace and comfort to a troubled heart and a pain-filled soul...and then experience the joy of reconciliation with God, with our fellow Christians and with oneself...*

*"I also gladly and tenderly reflect upon the '**love commitment**' a young loving couple make - as they happily prepare to celebrate their wedding vows and again, I realize how very important it was for them to have the sacramental blessing of the priest – the blessing of Christ upon their love and their lives...*

*"With the new excited parents, I joyfully share the gift of their **new-born child** as we warmly and prayerfully prepare for the sacrament of Baptism, realizing what a wonderful gift of Life they have been given by the grace of God. How gratefully they offer thanks to the priest who has christened their precious baby into the Lord Jesus...*

*"And I peacefully pause and quietly whisper a heartfelt prayer: '**Thank you, Lord Jesus, for letting me serve you as your priest!**'"*

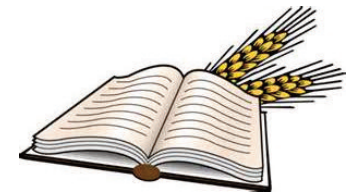

Life Issues Bulletin February 2018

"To serve human life is to serve God. All life, from life in the mother's womb to that of the elderly, the suffering and the sick, and to that of the troublesome and even repellent, is to be welcomed, loved and helped." (Pope Francis, January 1, 2018, New Year homily)



Lifelines will appear four times a year, to remind us of this message of love for life. We are responsible to God to care for every life, from birth to natural death, and for the weak and helpless especially.

Saved by a Song

A few months ago, some people from Holy Family Church in St. Albert, Alberta, were praying across the street from the abortion clinic. Inspired to start singing that early morning, they soon noticed a woman looking at them from across the street. She came over to them and said she was irresistibly drawn by their singing, was pregnant and desperate, and going for an abortion.

They talked, urged her to consider life for her child, and offered help. They kept in touch. Months later, a happy mother and newborn came to Holy Family Church, to receive a generous shower of love and gifts.

Dying naturally

"Dying naturally allows terminal patients time for resolution and growth," declares Dr. Luke Savage, family physician in Three Hills, Alberta. "We don't hear these stories in the news. We don't hear of the truly brave people who want something more than death, who refuse to lose hope."

His patient, Ann, a few years into retirement, was quite healthy. But earlier this spring, tests showed advanced metastatic ovarian cancer. Surgery was not an option. Chemo would only give a few extra months plus unwanted side effects. Ann did not turn to despair, fear or defiance and seek to end it all. Rather, she turned to family, friends and faith in God.

*May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you,
what rich glories he has promised that the saints will inherit... Eph 1:18*

Ann explains, "We have so much excellent help available to control symptoms. I do not fear that I will experience uncontrollable pain or suffering. To me, emotional pain is a powerful amplifier of physical pain. I am finding peace. I am not desperate to prolong life. To die naturally in the presence of my family is my hope."

Seek Sound Advice before Making a Life and Death Decision

Be wise and discerning in what you read or overhear in a conversation or see in the media. Deceptive, irreligious ideas might sound quite acceptable at first, for example; "*Euthanasia is o.k. God doesn't want us to suffer.*" But is that true? Consider Jesus on the cross!

Suffering, when accepted, and united in love and faith to Christ, can actually work towards nobility, inner and relational healing, holiness, compassion, prayer and an intimate relationship with God. This is not the easy path. However, uniting ourselves to Christ is the best path.

From the Fathers of the Church:

The cross is the door to mysteries. Through this door the intellect makes entrance in to the knowledge of heavenly mysteries. The knowledge of the cross is concealed in the sufferings of the cross. And the more our participation in its sufferings, the greater the perception we gain through the cross. For, as the Apostle says, 'As the sufferings of Christ abound in us, so our consolation also aboundeth by Christ.'
