Ukrainian Catholic Brotherhood Background information on how the Ukrainian Catholic Brotherhood (UCBC) was formed.

A Saskatchewan government directive in 1929 forbid the religious teachings in schools- no religious classes, priests, brothers or sisters could not be seen visiting a school, Ukrainian Catholics lost their jobs etc.

The members of the Catholic faith objected to this and along with Father Stefan Semczuk, took charge to organize a strong voice in protest to the government. Fr. Semczuk said, "I believe we should form our own Ukrainian organization to defend the rights of the Ukrainian Catholic people. Father Stefan Semczuk, a 32 year old priest from Alvena, Saskatchewan along with 7 men, mainly school trustees, first met in Regina and organized the historic first Ukrainian Catholic Convention in Saskatoon for Dec 28 & 29, 1932. Over 300 delegates attended. With full support of Bishop Ladyka, this convention approved the formation of the organization Ukrainian Catholic Brotherhood. Following dozens of meetings in farm homes, the UCBC had its beginnings, In the first three years, 64 branches were formed in Saskatchewan and later many branches were formed across Canada,

At first the men, women and youth were members of the Brotherhood. Later, the ladies seeing that they could assist the parish in many other ways, decided to form their own organization—the UCWL of Canada. On June 15, 1944 the UCWL was founded in Yorkton and the UCBC became an organization of men only. The youth formed their own organization-- the UCY.

The three organizations had their birth place in Saskatchewan and formed branches across Canada. The UCBC is the oldest Ukrainian Catholic organization. The UCBC is the founding member of the Ukrainian Canadian Congress and is the parent organization of the UCWLC & UCY.

The Aims of the Brotherhood are

- -develop and enrich the religious and spiritual life in the parish, hereby strengthening the Ukrainian Catholic Church.
- -preserve, develop and perpetuate the Ukrainian language and culture to strengthen our identity.
- -strengthen the spiritual and moral values of Canadian life.
- -initiate and support programs of charitable and social action which exemplify Christian ideals of justice and love.

The Yorkton Branch formed:

The Yorkton Branch of the Brotherhood was formed on February 15, 1942.

In the 1940's and for many years later, the Brotherhood looked after the old parish hall at the corner of Darlington and Ontario Ave. such as the repairs, upkeep, painting, grass cutting, snow removal, paying all utilities, caretaking, maintenance, bookings for all events while the UCWLC did the catering of banquets. The youth used the hall for Ukrainian Dancing classes. This carried on for many years until the new hall (St. Mary's Cultural Centre) was built in 1983.

UCBC Membership

Membership to the Brotherhood is open to all Ukrainian Catholic men who are willing to commit themselves to work for the good of the Ukrainian Catholic Church, the Ukrainian people and for Canada. You do not have to speak Ukrainian but you must belong to a Ukrainian Catholic Church.

At present there are UCBC branches in Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Ontario.

As a member of the Brotherhood, our main objective is to help the parish priest, the church and the parish.

Brotherhood members in our parish serve as ushers, choir members, cantors, sacristan, Eucharistic Ministers, readings, visiting the sick, provide pussy willows for Palm Sunday, greenery for Pentecost, carnations for Mother's Day, gifts to First Communicants, provide the Brotherhood crosses to parishioners and others, assist with any work in and around the church and assist the pastor when needed. The UCBC provides various charitable donations to our church, groups, and organizations.

UCBC Donations:

Our only Brotherhood fund raising in Yorkton is through the Brotherhood Eparchial raffle and proceeds from Bingo.

Some of the areas that we donated to are:

- -the Brotherhood raised funds to complete the east wing of the church in 1955.

EVE OF THE NATIVITY OF OUR LORD

Sunday Tropar, tone 5: Let us the faithful acclaim and worship the Word,* co-eternal with the Father and the Spirit,* and born of the Virgin for our salvation.* For He willed to be lifted up on the cross in the flesh,* to suffer death and to raise the dead* by His glorious resurrection.



Tropar of the Holy Fathers, **tone 2**: The three young men who are the great guides of the faith,* rejoiced in the pit of flame as if they were in a water of rest;* and the prophet Daniel appeared as a shepherd to the lions.* O Christ God, save our souls for their sake.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and for ever and ever. Amen!

Sunday Kondak, tone 3: Today the Virgin is on her way to the cave* where she will give birth in a manner beyond understanding* to the Word Who is in all eternity.* Rejoice, therefore, universe, when you hear it hearlded.* With the angels and the shepherds, glorify Him* Who chose to be seen as a newborn babe* while remaining God in all eternity.

Prokimen, tone 4: Blessed are you, and praiseworthy, O Lord, the God of our fathers, and glorious forever is your name.

Verse: For you are just in all you have done.

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Hebrews 11:9-10;17-23; 32-40

Brothers and Sisters! By faith Abraham sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations whose designer and maker is God. By faith Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac; he who had received the promises was ready to sacrifice his only son, of whom it was said, "Through Isaac shall your descendants be called." He reasoned that God was able to raise from the dead, and so he received Isaac back as a symbol. By faith Isaac invoked for Jacob and Esau blessings that were still to be. By faith Jacob, when dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph, and worshipped God, leaning on the head of his staff. By faith Joseph, near the end of his life spoke of the Exodus of the Israelites, and gave instructions about his burial. By faith Moses' parents hid him for three months after his birth, thereby disregarding the king's edict because they saw that he was a beautiful child. What more shall I recount? I have no time to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets, who by faith conquered kingdoms, did what was just, obtained the promises; they broke the jaws of lions, put out raging fires, escaped the devouring sword; though weak they were made powerful, became strong in battle, and turned back foreign invaders. Women received back their dead through resurrection. Others were tortured and would not receive deliverance, in order to obtain a better resurrection. Still others endured mockery, scourging, even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, sawed in two, put to death at sword's point; they went about garbed in the skins of sheep or goats, needy, afflicted, tormented. The world was not worthy of them. They wandered about in deserts and on mountains, they dwelt in caves and in holes of the earth. Yet despite the fact that all of these were approved because of their faith, they did not obtain what had been promised. God had made a better plan, a plan which included us. Without us, they were not to be made perfect.

Alleluia Verses: O God, our ears have heard, our fathers have declared to us.

But you have saved us from our foes, and those who hated us you put to shame.

Gospel: Matthew 1: 1 - 25

A family record of Jesus Christ, Son of David, son of Abraham. Abraham was the father of Isaac. Isaac the father of Jacob. Jacob the father of Judah and his brothers. Judah was the father of Perez and Zerah. whose mother was Tamar. Perez was the father of Hezron, Hezron the father of Ram. Ram was the father of Amminadab, Amminadab the father of Nahshon, Nahshon the father of Salmon. Salmon was the father of Boaz, whose mother was Rahab, Boaz was the father of Obed, whose mother was Ruth. Obed was the father of Jesse, Jesse the father of King David, David was the father of Solomon, whose mother had been the wife of Uriah. Solomon was the father of Rehoboam, Rehoboam the father of Abijah, Abijah the father of Asa. Asa was the father of Jehosaphat, Jehosaphat the father of Joram, Joram the father of Uzziah. Uzziah was the father of Jotham, Jotham the father of Ahaz, Ahaz the father of Hezekiah. Hezekiah was the father of Manesseh, Manesseh the father of Amos, Amos the father of Josiah. Josiah became the father of Jechoniah and his brothers at the time of the Babylonian exile. After the Babylonian exile Jechoniah was the father of Shealtiel, Shealtiel the father of Zerubbabel. Zerubbabel was the father of Abiud, Abiud the father of Eliakim, Eliakim the father of Azor. Azor was the father of Zadok, Zadok the father of Achim, Achim the father of Eliud. Eliud was the father of Eleazar. Eleazar the father of Matthan, Matthan the father of Jacob. Jacob was the father of Joseph the husband of Mary. It was of her that Jesus who is called the Messiah was born. Thus the total number of generations is: from Abraham to David, fourteen generations; from David to the Babylonian captivity, fourteen generations; from the Babylonian captivity to the Messiah, fourteen generations. Now this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the power of the Holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, an upright man unwilling to expose her to the law, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when suddenly the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream and said to him: "Joseph, son of David, have no fear about taking Mary as your wife. It is by the Holy Spirit that she has conceived this child. She is to have a son and you are to name him Jesus because he will save his people from their sins. All this happened to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "The virgin shall be with child and give birth to a son, and they shall call him Emmanuel," a name which means "God is with us." When Joseph awoke he did as the angel of the Lord had directed him and received her into his home as his wife. He had no relations with her at any time before she bore a son, whom he named Jesus.

Epistle: A reading from the Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Galatians 1: 11 - 19

Brothers and Sisters! I assure you, the gospel I proclaimed to you is no mere human invention. I did not receive it from any man, nor was I schooled in it. It came by revelation from Jesus Christ. You have heard, I know, the story of my former way of life in Judaism. You know that I went to extremes in persecuting the Church of God and tried to destroy it; I made progress in Jewish observance far beyond most of my contemporaries, in my excess of zeal to live out all the traditions of my ancestors. But the time came when he who had set me apart before I was born and called me by his favor chose to reveal his Son to me, that I might spread among the Gentiles the good tidings concerning him. Immediately, without seeking human advisers or even going to Jerusalem to see those who were apostles before me, I went off to Arabia; later I returned to Damascus. Three years after that I went up to Jerusalem to get to know Cephas, with whom I stayed fifteen days. I did not meet any other apostles except James, the brother of the Lord.

Gospel: Matthew 2: 13 - 23

After the wise men had left, the angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph with the command: "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you otherwise. Herod is searching for the child to destroy him." Joseph got up and took the child and his mother and left that night for Egypt. He stayed there until the death of Herod, to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: "Out of Egypt I have called my son." Once Herod realized that he had been deceived by the wise men, he became furious. He ordered the massacre of all the boys two years old and under in Bethlehem and its environs, making his calculations on the basis of the date he had learned from the wise men. What was said through Jeremiah the prophet was then fulfilled: "A cry was heard at Ramah, sobbing and loud lamentations: Rachel bewailing her children; no comfort for her, since they are no more." But after Herod's death, the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt with the command: "Get up, take the child and his mother, and set out for the land of Israel. Those who had designs on the life of the child are dead." He got up, took the child and his mother, and returned to the land of Israel. He heard however, that Archelaus had succeeded his father Herod as king of Judea, and he was afraid to go back there. Instead, because of a warning received in a dream, Joseph went to the region of Galilee. There he settled in a town called Nazareth. In this way what was said through the prophet was fulfilled: "He shall be called a Nazorean."

Instead of 'It is truly right...': My soul, praise Christ the King* born in a cave.* Behold a strange and wonderful mystery:* the cave has become heaven,* the Virgin a throne of the Cherubim,* and the manger a noble place where Christ our God reposes.* Wherefore let us praise and exalt Him!
