This school, called St. Francis, will be located on a ten acre complex that is part of Christ the King Parish where the Clarist Sisters are working to provide education to the children. The Sisters have been working at the parish and general area for the last two years and currently provide teaching, pictorial, medical and social services to the people. The dispensary is being run and maintained by the Sisters. While the Clarists are looking up to CCCI to fund the construction work they are also looking for other donor partners. The religious order to which the Sisters belong and the local parish will cover the operating cost of the school but hope to establish a sponsorship program.





There is currently no school in the area but the need and desire is great The planned school will serve roughly 250 children between the ages of 5 and 14. The plan is to build a two storey building with 10 classrooms.
