The student on stage simply looked at the audience and loudly said, "God bless you all!"

And he walked off the stage ...

The audience exploded into applause. This graduating class had found a unique way to invoke God's blessings on their future with or without the secular court's approval.

This is a true story; it happened at the University of Maryland.

As we joyfully and prayerful celebrate our **Annual Vidpust**, we fondly recall the large crowds of pilgrims who travelled from near and far to strengthen their Catholic faith. As the song goes, *"Those were the days..."*.

Eparchy of Saskatoon Famíly and Lífe Office Bulletín: June 2017 "The future of the world passes through the famíly" St. John Paul II, Famíliaris Consortio, 79

Many parents are concerned about their children and other family member who have either left the Church or do not practice their faith. This is the first of a series of articles addressing this challenging issue that almost every family deals with. There is hope and there are practical things we can do to make a difference in the lives of those we love.

Becoming Witnesses of the Living Christ Part I: The Power of God's Love

Often when those we love take positions that we do not agree with we respond with disappointment at their choices and perspectives. Sometimes we combine this with advice that is generally not well received. Often we do this without ever really listening to their reasons. Sometimes we say nothing, not wanting to argue. We are often completely frustrated and feel it is no use; there is nothing we can do. So what is the answer?

The key to our relationships with those we love is honesty. Honesty with ourselves about who we are and where we are at is always a good place to start. We cannot control the choices of others, so it is often best to start with ourselves. What is our relationship to God? Is it a close intimate relationship that profoundly changes us and affects every aspect of our lives or is it somewhat distant—limited to Church on Sunday? Is even that short time together formal and somewhat uncomfortable? Do we honestly talk to God? Do we listen? Do we follow Him with all our heart?

Once we can be honest with ourselves about how we can grow in our relationship with God, we are ready to be honest with those we love. Pope Francis challenges us: "The questions I would put to parents are these: 'Do we seek to understand 'where' our children really are in their journey? Where is their soul, do we really know? And above all, do we want to know?' *Amoris Laetitia, 261*

Many of us are afraid to ask our kids these questions because we are afraid of the answer. When we feel this way we need to remind ourselves of the power of God and His desire to pour out His grace and healing on both our children and us. Sometimes we believe in the love of God but forget the incredible power of that Love, which is not just a feeling but is rather the most powerful force in the universe.



We just came out of the Easter Season, which teaches us that the power (love) of God can bring the dead back to life. At Pentecost the powerful love of God gave birth to the Church by giving courage and wisdom to the fearful and weak disciples. The powerful love of God turns bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, and then Christ offers himself to be united with us, our body and blood, changing our hearts and transforming us into the men and women we were created to be—WOW! We just celebrated that in the Feast of the Eucharist. The list of feasts goes on— be assured that as God gave John the Baptist or Sts. Peter and Paul the courage to live fearlessly and proclaim the beauty of truth, He wants to give you that courage as well.

This is personal! Where do we start?

- Start at the next (or even this) Divine Liturgy. When Fr. says "Let us commend ourselves, each other and our whole life to Christ our God." Make your response of "To you O Lord" the prayer of your heart. Take note every time you say this in every Divine Liturgy. Think specifically about your life and the lives of those you love name those you are praying for.
- 2. Don't stop there. Every day, commend (that just means "to entrust") yourself, all your relationships, and your whole life—everything you do, to Christ, our God. Entrust your loved ones by name whenever you pray, while you work or when you are giving thanks before meals.
- 3. As you entrust your adult children, and other loved ones to Christ, remember that God doesn't just want them to go through the motions – He wants their hearts. If they are not going to Church, if they are not living a Christian life, let go of worrying about that and pray for the conversion of their hearts—the rest will follow. Understand that God gives them (and us) freedom so that we have the power to choose to respond to the love of God.
- 4. Work at living your own faith with joy and unwavering commitment. Attend Divine Liturgy more often, participate actively, join a Bible Study, or consider joining the Lay Formation program.
