Dear Beloved Parishioners and Guests.

In the past few days all of us have warmly and graciously greeted one another with the standard wish: *Happy New Year!* Are we truly aware of "what" we are wishing for one another? "Her husband of 70 years recently passed away, making the move necessary. After many hours of waiting patiently in the lobby, she smiled sweetly when told her room was ready. "As she maneuvered her walker to the elevator, I provided a visual description of her tiny room, including the eyelet sheets that had been hung on her window.

"I love it," she stated with the enthusiasm of an eight-year-old, having just been presented with a new puppy.

"Mrs. Jones, you haven't seen the room ... just wait."

"That doesn't have anything to do with it," she replied. "Happiness is something you decide on ahead of time. Whether I like the room or not doesn't depend on how the furniture is arranged... it's how I arrange my mind. I already decided to love it...

"It's a decision I make every morning when I wake up. I have a choice; I can spend the day in bed recounting the difficulty I have with the parts of my body that no longer work, or get out of bed and be thankful for the ones that do. Each day is a gift, and as long as my eyes are open, I'll focus on the new day and all the happy memories I've stored away... just for this time in my life. Old age is like a bank account.. you withdraw from what you've put in...

"So my advice to you would be to deposit a lot of happiness in the bank account of memories. Thank you for your part in filling my Memory bank. I am still depositing ... "

What will be our "attitude" this year? Will our moods dictate how we "act" or "re-act" to ourselves, to others, and to God's plan for us? Will we make 2018 a wonderful year for "ourselves" and "for others"? So very much depends on us and "our attitude"...

With God's help, I promise with my whole heart and soul to do my utmost to make this a wonderful, joyful, loveful and blessed 2018!



Dear parents/guardians and friends of Catholic Education;

Thank you for choosing Catholic education for your child(ren) and for keeping Catholic Education in your prayers.

We have an update on the Theodore court case ruling. All eight Catholic boards in the province are working together to explore funding the appeal of the decision last April by Justice Layh. We are committed to raising the funds without using operational monies given to us for classrooms. We are asking your help to defray the costs.

As was communicated previously in earlier correspondence, the Saskatchewan Catholic School Boards Association (SCSBA) set up a website for donations in June: https://www.catholicedspirit.ca. We thank those who have already donated.

Since we will be in court by mid-2018, we must now begin an official major fundraising campaign to help us cover present and future legal costs. Our collective goal is to raise \$300,000 to pay for the legal counsel anticipated for both the Saskatchewan Court of Appeals and the potential Supreme Court of Canada. We are optimistic that this goal will be reached with the kindness and generosity of our stake-holders.

We have about 40,000 students in Saskatchewan who attend Catholic schools and we will do whatever is necessary to help protect a parent's ability to choose a faith-based Catholic education for their child(ren). We believe in what our Catholic schools have to offer and acknowledge you do as well. We therefore encourage you to consider contributing to our collective challenge during our Official Fundraising Campaign. Details on how to donate are at www.christtheteacher.ca. Tax receipts can be issued for donations.

Lastly, we would like to emphasize that we have been offering Catholic education (not just education to Catholics) for over 125 years in the province of Saskatchewan. By the grace of God and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we have weathered many storms. We have faith and hope this current situation will be no different. Parents with a genuine desire to access a Catholic education for their children will continue to be welcomed in Catholic schools this year and for many years to come.

Please continue to pray for Catholic education in Saskatchewan. Blessings in Christ,

PATRIARCH SVIATOSLAV OF THE UGCC: "I AGREE TO BECOME AN ORGAN DONOR AFTER DEATH"

May we in Canada follow his good example; just for the record, I have the "organ permission" in my wallet. - Fr. Bohdan



We need to create a culture where people are not afraid to do good - even when their earthly path is over.

The Head of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church, Patriarch Svyatoslav (Shevchuk) expressed this stance live in the interactive program "Open Church" on the issue of organs transplantation, reports the Department of Information of the UGCC.

The program presented the sociological studies, according to which 63% of respondents in Ukraine agreed to become donors, 25% were against, 12% are yet undecided what should be done to them after figures very good, although as compared for example, to Austria, almost 100% of people are ready to become donors after death there.

His Beatitude Sviatoslav expressed his complete consent to become an organ donor. "If after death I will have a chance to continue doing good, then why not," said the head of the UGCC.

In his conviction, we in Ukraine need to develop a culture where people would not be afraid to do good even when their earthly path was over. "If we can do good even after our deaths, that is, if our bodies can save someone's life after our death, then I suppose this must be done," said the Head of the Church.

His Beatitude Sviatoslav continues, "I am confident that in Ukraine there are professional, wise doctors, and there are many people who are ready to save another person's life by giving their bodies even after their death. We only need a culture for this. Ukrainian legislation should also complete the appropriate development path, because the current situation only worsens the organ transplant cause and de facto indirectly stimulates the so-called 'black transplantology'."

"I think we all need to understand what the moral benefit of such an act is, how we need to act personally and how to ensure that patients in need of such help can be saved in their native Ukraine," the Head of the UGCC underscores.
