As you know, the Saskatchewan Re-opening Roadmap began with Step 1 on Sunday

May 30. We have sought clarification on a number of details raised by you or another faith leader. Here is a summary of the upcoming changes:



In Step 1, beginning Sunday, May 30:
 maximum capacity of a place of worship will be increased to 30% of seating capacity, with a maximum of 150 people in the entire facility.

• 2 metre distancing, masking, sanitizing, and contact tracing will continue to be required. • sharing food or drink is prohibited in Step 1.

• other non-worship gatherings will be allowed to a maximum of **30 people**.

 non-worship gatherings held concurrently with a worship service are allowed but the total number of people in the worship service and additional gathering may not exceed 150 people.
 non-essential travel is not recommended outside Saskatchewan.

In Step 2, beginning June 20, there will be few changes affecting places of worship:

maximum capacity will remain 30% of seating capacity, with a maximum of 150 people in the entire facility.
2 metre distancing, masking, sanitizing, and contact tracing will continue to be required.
sharing food or drink is prohibited in Step 2.

• other non-worship gatherings will be allowed to a maximum of **150 people**.

non-worship gatherings held concurrently with a worship service are allowed but the total number of people in the worship service and additional gathering may not exceed 150 people.
non-essential travel is not recommended outside Saskatchewan.

<u>Step 3 is anticipated in mid-July</u>. In Step 3 most restrictions will be lifted. There will be no limits on capacity, food and drink will be permitted, physical distancing and contact tracing will not be required. It is expected that masks and sanitizing will be advised for some time, but the public health emergency will end, and the public health orders will be lifted soon after Step 3 begins.

Further advice will be provided in the coming weeks.

TROPARS, KONDAKS, EPISTLE & GOSPEL FOR SUNDAY, JUNE 6 FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY EUCHARIST



First Antiphon: The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. In verdant pastures he gives me repose.

Through the prayers of the Mother of God, O Savior, save us. Even though I walk in the dark valley I fear no evil; for you are at my side. *Through the prayers of the Mother of God, O Savior, save us.* You spread the table before me in the sight of my foes. *Through the prayers of the Mother of God, O Savior, save us.*

Glory be . . . now and forever . . . : Only Begotten Son

Third Antiphon: When I call, answer me, O my just God.

Tropar, **tone 4**: Your memorial sacrifice, Christ our God,* became a festive day for the world.* For fishermen were taught by you* to offer you the unbloody sacrifice with bread and wine,* to recall your divine memorial act* which we celebrate; proclaiming:* O Lord, glory be to you. Offer just sacrifices, and trust in the Lord.

Your memorial sacrifice.....

You put gladness into my heart, more than when grain and wine abound. *Your memorial sacrifice.....*

At the Little Entrance: I will offer you a sacrifice of praise; I will call upon the name of the Lord. Your memorial sacrifice.....

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and for ever and ever. Amen!

Kondak, tone 4: Behold, Christ becomes present as food for all.* Come let us prostrate ourselves in worship of Christ, our God,* hidden in these Mysteries* and let us cry out in humility:* "Lord, do not destroy us sinners by fire when we communicate,* but burn our sins and purify our souls.

Prokimen, tone 4: I will feed them with the best of wheat, and with honey from the rock I will fill them.

Verse: Sing joyfully to God our strength.

Epistle: A reading from the First Letter of the Holy Apostle Paul to the Corinthians 11: 23 - 32

Brothers and Sisters: I received from the Lord what I handed on to you, namely, that the Lord Jesus on the night in which he was betrayed took bread, and after he had given thanks, broke it and said, "This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way, after the supper, he took the cup, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this whenever you drink it, in remembrance of me." Every time, then, you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes! This means that whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily sins against the body and blood of the Lord. A man should examine himself first; only then should he eat of the bread and drink of the cup. He who eats and drinks without recognizing the body eats and drinks a judgment on himself. That is why many among you are sick and infirm, and why so many are dying. If we were to examine ourselves, we would not be falling under judgment in this way; but since it is the Lord who judges us, he chastens us to keep us from being condemned with the rest of the world.

Alleluia Verses: The eyes of all look hopefully to you, and you give them their food in due season.

You open your hand and satisfy the desire of every living thing

Gospel: John 6: 48 - 54

The Lord said: "I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate manna in the desert, but they died. This is the bread that comes down from heaven for a man to eat and never die. I myself am the living bread come down from heaven. If anyone eats this bread he shall live forever; the bread I will give is my flesh, for the life of the world." At this the Jews quarreled among themselves, saying, "How can he give us his flesh to eat?" Thereupon Jesus said to them: "Let me solemnly assure you, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. He who feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood has life eternal, and I will raise him on the last day."

Instead of 'It is truly right....': My soul, extol the Lord,* who gave his flesh as mystical food.* My soul, extol Christ our God,* who gave his flesh for man's salvation.* You are all desire. You are all delight,* word of God, son of the Virgin,* Lord, the God of gods,* you are the holiest of the holy.* For this we extol you* with her who bore you.

Communion Hymn: "Whoever feeds on my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in him, said the Lord." Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!

Third Antiphon: My heart bursts forth with a noble theme; I tell my works to the king.

Tropar, tone 6: Have mercy on us, O Lord, have mercy on us.* We sinners bring this appeal to You, O Master,* for we have no defense.* Have mercy on us.

You are more radiant in beauty than the sons of men; grace flowed from your lips. *Have mercy on us, O Lord.....*

In your splendor and your beauty bend your bow, prosper and reign for the sake of truth, meekness and beauty.

At the Little Entrance: Sing praise to the Lord, for he is good, for his mercy is forever. *Have mercy on us, O Lord......*

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit; now and for ever and ever. Amen!

Kondak, tone 8: To you, Lord, my Commander and Champion,* I your servant, ascribe my victories.* Delivered from eternal death* I address my thanks to you.* Since you have ineffable mercy,* free me from all kinds of danger as I cry out:* "Jesus, son of God, have mercy on me."

Prokimen, tone 4: I will proclaim your name to my brethren; in the midst of the assembly I will sing your praises. Verse: *I will fulfill my vows before those who fear him.* Epistle: A reading from the Epistle to the Hebrews. (2: 11 - 18)

Brothers and Sisters! He who consecrates and those who are consecrated have one and the same Father. Therefore he is not ashamed to call them brothers, saying, "I will announce your name to my brothers, I will sing your praise in the midst of the assembly"; and, "I will put my trust in him"; and again, "Here am I, and the children God has given me?" Now since the children are men of blood and flesh, Jesus likewise had a full share in ours, that by his death he might rob the devil, the prince of death, of his power, and free those who through fear of death had been slaves their whole life long. Surely he did not come to help angels, but rather the children of Abraham; therefore he had to become like his brothers in every way, that he night be a merciful and faithful high priest before God on their behalf. to expiate the sins of the people. Since he was himself tested through what he suffered, he is able to help those who are tempted.

Alleluia Verses: All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord. All the families of the nations shall fall down before him.

Gospel: John 3: 13 - 17

The Lord said, No one has gone to heaven except the One who came down from there -- the Son of Man who is in heaven. Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that all who believe may have eternal life in him. Yes, God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him may not die but may have eternal life. God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."
