1. **Meeting was called to order** by Geraldine Koban at 7:00 pm.

2. **Opening Prayer:** Led by Father Larry Kondra

Minutes of Joint Meeting between St. Mary's Parish Council and St. Mary's Cultural Centre Board of Directors. Held in Father Delaere Room, St. Mary's Cultural Centre.

3. **Proposed relocation of Parish Offices**

Explanation of activity to date – Father Bohdan Lukie CSsR

- The Monastery has 23 bedrooms. At present, there as 2 priests living there.

- We are looking at possible alternatives to the Monastery. We recognize that the parishioners would like the building to remain. It is a part of the history of Yorkton.

- The Priests do have the Duplex on Maple Ave, presently occupied by Father Bohdan, with accommodations available for the other Priests.

- One option being considered is renovating the Heritage Room. Need to consider whether this is good or bad for the Parish and the Cultural Centre. We need guidance from all.

Father Larry Kondra:

- Pope Francis has spoken about the two purposes of a church:

- 1. To warm hearts
- 2. To heal wounds

- We need to consider what we can do better, remembering we live in a world of business, not necessarily a Christian world

- We are here for discernment. We need to reach a place of peace, then unity and time to reach a decision.

- The Cultural Centre Board of Directors is a part of the Parish Council
- Our focus is on the relocation of the Parish offices

- We need to act while we can – all of us are getting older. We have to watch so we don't act or operate out of fear, but go forward in peace and love.

- There are two kinds of conversation:

- 1. One of no possibilities, creates blame and division
- 2. One of possibilities, sees potential, unites people and gives hope

- Facts: Looked at using Redeemers Press building, however it is not useable due to the past use of toxic inks, etc. Considered a mobile unit or add-on unit, but there are significant costs involved. The Cultural Centre is close by and there is space that would be suitable. It will take time and commitment and we need to work through this together.

- We need to consider the future of the Parish. Does the size of the Cultural Centre fit with the present and future needs of the Parish.

Question and Answer:

1. How much space is needed for the Parish Offices?

Approximately 1200 sq ft is needed. Not sure if an external entrance would be required.

2. How much will it impact the revenue of the Cultural Centre?

The Heritage Room is used for the larger functions. If the space is not available then some events will look to other venues. Potentially this could put 40 – 45% of the Cultural Centre's revenue at risk. Occupancy costs (heat power, taxes, etc) average about \$100,000 per year. Average profit of approximately \$20,000 per year.

3. What is the cost of renting office space at another location? *Rental costs range from \$10.00 per sq ft to \$18.00 per sq ft.*

Comment: there is a need for availability of the Priests to the Church. Also the office staff need access to the church.

4. What about renovating the basement under the church? *The location is poor, it is not easily accessible. Any renovations would possibly involve bringing the building up to code.*

Comment: the present building is sound. Suggestion made that we need an opinion from an architect as to the options available. Need to consider updating and renovating the Monastery basement, main floor, 2nd floor and closing up the 3rd floor.

5. Is renovating the Monastery an option?

An architectural firm from Saskatoon did give 6 different scenarios, costs ranged from \$500,000 to 1.5 million and possibly higher.

6. What is the cost of demolition?

It depends on the company and whether anything would be salvaged. The wall would need to be rebuilt between the Church and Monastery. If the Monastery was to be sold as is, there would be the cost of separating the two buildings with a fire wall, etc.
